

## **Engineering Gateways MSc Professional Engineering Extracts from IET Feedback on Learning Contracts received so far**

### Typical phrasing of acceptance

“The IET considers that completion of your proposed programme of learning can be expected to equip you with Masters level knowledge appropriate to that expected of a Chartered Engineer.”

“For your application for professional registration to be successful, the IET will require evidence that you are competent to the standards set out in UK-SPEC at the time. You should expect to demonstrate how your work experience provides the necessary evidence and to justify this at interview. “

“You should maintain a record of your competence development using the Career Manager process.”

### Personalised feedback to both member and university

“The lack of precision regarding current roles, career history and previous qualifications makes an estimate of the current competency level difficult to assess. In respect of academic criteria for entry to the programme, we are trusting the universities own admission assessment process. One way of demonstrating the current competency level is by registration as an Incorporated Engineer.”

“In section A1 – it was noted that x states “The Model will include all aspects of financial appraisal and it will be presented to Senior Management” our concern here is that there should be a technical engineering based analysis, from which financial considerations will flow.”

“Both your first degree and training scheme are accredited by the IET. You appear to be making solid progress and it was slightly surprising that you felt that you had nothing to offer in competencies B1 & C4. Given the strong IET Accredited base that you have already formed we suggest that you align your MSc study closely to your personal career objectives in consultation with your employer. This suggestion is made because we consider you to be potentially a particularly strong candidate for Chartered Engineer in due course and would want you to gain maximum personal benefit from your MSc study programme. “

“BEng degrees at the x University are not currently accredited by the IET. Therefore some significant technical content should be included to minimise any doubt that may arise from the uncertain BEng quality.”

“Whilst your current job title of x may not convince the IET Assessors that you have the responsibilities of a Chartered Engineer, after completion of your MSc programme, at the point when you are ready to apply for your PRI, you may have been given more responsibility and your role upgraded to reflect this.”

“Section x of your Learning Contract was mainly descriptive, rather than reflective and self-critical. Based on the current information you have provided in this section, you may wish to use this to apply for registration as an Incorporated Engineer now in order to form a platform on which you can build upon your competences to CEng level, in parallel with your MSc work based learning.”
