### **Presentation of the 2018 Annual Report**

### Presentation of the Accounts for the year ending 31 December 2018

The Annual Accounts for 2018 were introduced by the Chairman on behalf of the Chairman of the Finance, Audit and Remuneration Panel (FARP).

In response to a question regarding the lower investment gain in 2018 compared to the previous years, it was clarified that this had been addressed with the investment managers by the executive staff and Panel and that there was a recognition by the investment managers that the organisation's investment performance needed to improve in 2019.
